**1. Annual Meeting:** The 130th Meeting of the Association of Clinical Scientists will be held at the St. Anthony Hotel in San Antonio, Texas, from Wednesday, 12 May, to Sunday, 16 May 2010. The meeting will be hosted by the University of Texas Health Science Center–San Antonio (UTHSCSA). The scientific program, entitled ***The Frontiers of Clinical Science***, will feature the Abraham J Gitlitz Memorial Lecture on “**Lipoproteins, infection, homocysteine, and the vulnerable plaque,**” presented by **Kilmer S McCully, Chief of the Pathology and Laboratory Medicine Service at the Boston VA Medical Center.** The scientific program will feature a Symposium on Transfusion Medicine and Blood Coagulation, and platform sessions of keynote lectures and research papers will be devoted to Cell and Tissue Pathology, Clinical Biochemistry and Biotechnology, Clinical Molecular Biology and Genetics, Oncology and Proteomics, Clinical Immunology and Microbiology, Hematology and Transfusion Medicine, Therapeutics and Toxicology, Clinical Informatics and Computer Systems, and Clinical Science in Practice. A Surgical Pathology Tutorial on aberrant tumors of the respiratory tract, with case presentations by pathology residents, will be given by Jaishree Jagirdar, Director of Anatomic Pathology at UTHSCSA, and a tour of UTHSCSA’s clinical laboratories is also planned.

At the Association’s Annual Reception and Banquet, Carl Hacker, Houston, TX, will present, “Life in Texas in 1833”. The Association’s awards for 2010 will be presented as follows:

- Young Clinical Scientist Awards, presented by Frederick Muschenheim to Consolato M. Sergi, Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, and L. Brannon Thomas, Tampa, FL
- Diploma of Honor, presented by Robert E. Brown to M. Kent Froberg, Virginia, MN
- Clinical Scientist of the Year Award, presented by Peter Farmer to Joseph A. Knight, Salt Lake City, UT
