

## **Membership**

The American Osteopathic College of Pathologists, Inc. (AOCF) had a stable year in 2010, the total membership of AOCF remained the same as the previous year. A membership drive was completed reducing the membership fee by 50% in hopes of increasing the membership. Student members and resident members were mostly acquired through the membership drive which is good for the future of the AOCF. The member application was changed to reflect all categories of membership according to the bylaws and will hopefully be a plus in obtaining new members.

## **Finance**

Total net assets are down a percent from last year as of the November 2010 financial report. The dues renewal cycle was changed to better reflect the cash-based accounting system. A balance budget was approved for the year.

## **Structure/Organization**

AOCF has increased its exposure in the osteopathic community with attendance at the AOA House of Delegates. Dr. Laura Michael and Dr. Monroe Adams were the 2010 Delegates. The organization must continue to increase its visibility by participating in the AOA's Bureau of Osteopathic Specialty Societies (BOSS) and the American Society for Investigative Pathology.

## **CME Program**

The AOCF 2010 Fall Convention and Annual Business Meeting was a successful meeting in San Francisco, CA this year. Staff worked closely with Dr. Laura Michael, Program Chair, to put together the program and gather all required speaker materials. This year's program was held jointly with the American Osteopathic College of Radiology (AOCR) which was very successful. There were many new presenters that were very well received by the registrants. The 2011 program will be held in conjunction with the American Osteopathic Associations' Annual Convention which will be held in Orlando, FL, October 31<sup>st</sup> – November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

## **Collaboration**

The AOCF continues working closely with the AOBPa on creating a plan for Osteopathic Continuing Certification (OCC). All specialty boards have been charged with working with the specialty college to come up with a plan for OCC which is due to the standards review committee by April 2010 for implementation by the year 2013.
