Report to the Intersociety Pathology Council

February 29, 2016

Governance: The Association of Pathology Chairs has professional sections for the chairs of LCME-accredited institutions, and their residency program directors (PRODS), department administrators (PDAS) and undergraduate medical educators (UMEDS). In addition, hospital departments with ACGME or RCP accreditation may join and participate as affiliate members of APC. Pathology educators and chairs in newly formed schools, osteopathic schools, and unaffiliated hospitals may join APC as special members (individuals), with approval of APC Council. In 2011, a new subsection of PRODS was formed to support the professional networking of program coordinators, called the Graduate Medical Education Administrators Section (GMEAS). In 2015, the Leadership Development and Diversity Committee became a standing committee of APC. Also in 2015, an ad hoc committee of Senior Fellows was authorized by APC Council to organize and utilize the experience of former chairs of Pathology departments.

Leadership: APC's current President is Don Karcher, MD of The George Washington University. Tristram Parslow, MD, PhD of Emory University is President-Elect, and Ann Thor, MD of the University of Colorado, Denver is Past-President.

Meetings: The APC annual meeting is held each July. The next annual meeting will take place at the Rancho Bernardo Inn in San Diego, California from July 12-15, 2016, preceded by the sold-out Pathology Leadership Academy at the Hotel Del Coronado on July 11-12, 2016. The major theme of the upcoming annual meeting is ***Crafting the Vision to Lead***. The pre-meeting academy and annual meeting sessions are programmed toward this theme. APC's annual meetings are structured to allow simultaneous and separate programming for all professional sections (PRODS, UMEDS, PDAS and GMEAS) and all thematic areas – practice and management, graduate and undergraduate medical education, research, advocacy, and leadership development and diversity. APC Council and the Section Chairs embrace their responsibility to lead academic pathology into the future and cooperate to make the annual meeting the principle place for leaders in academic pathology to keep pace with significant and rapid changes in healthcare delivery, medical education and research. This year's plenary sessions will scan the horizons of the specialty, focusing on the changing financial landscapes and organizational models of pathology practice; on enlightened strategies to prepare a diverse, visionary pool of trainees and faculty for future leadership; on groundbreaking instruments and techniques that extend our view; and on discoveries in research and education that spotlight the critical role of pathology.

Regional meetings of the Northeast Chairs, and the Southeast and West/Midwest Chairs and Administrators, are held annually each fall to provide a forum for localized information exchange and interaction. These meetings are planned through the generous efforts of regional volunteer organizers, but without oversight by APC Council, and thus are not official APC meetings.

Communications: In addition to the professional listservs maintained for each of APC's Sections to communicate throughout the year, the association's newsletter – ***Paths to Progress*** – provides updates semi-annually to the membership and the general public about Section and Committee activities (including advocacy, major projects and new initiatives).
