Report to the Intersociety Pathology Council

Leadership: ASIP's current President is Dr. Charles Parkos, who will be succeeded by Dr. Martha Furie in July, 2011.

Membership: ASIP membership is 2,000.

Meetings: ASIP meets with several other member societies of FASEB each year at a meeting called Experimental Biology. The 2011 meeting will be in Washington DC from April 9-13. Guest societies sponsored by ASIP include American College of Veterinary Pathologists, American Society for Matrix Biology, International Society for Analytical and Molecular Morphology, International Society for Biological and Environmental Repositories (ISBER), and the Italian Pathology Society. Dr. Jay McDonald will receive the ASIP Gold-Headed Cane Award and Drs. Jordan Pober and Rakesh Jain will share the ASIP Rous-Whipple Award. Dr. Avrum Gotlieb will receive the Robbins Distinguished Educator Award.

Since 2008, ASIP has been holding a Summer Academy. The 2010 course "Molecular Mechanisms of Human Disease: Injury, Inflammation, Stem Cells, and Tissue Repair" will take place in Rockville, MD from June 26-28. The course is being offered as an online Immunopathology Self-Study Course starting in March 2011 and is eligible for SAM credit.

Divisions: The International Society for Biological and Environmental Repositories (ISBER) is a semi-autonomous Division of ASIP. The ISBER Annual Meeting will take place May 14-17, 2011 in the Washington DC metropolitan area.

Journals: ASIP's official journal is *The American Journal of Pathology* (AJP). In July, 2008, Dr. Michael Lisanti became the new Editor-in-Chief of the AJP. ASIP also co-publishes *The Journal of Molecular Diagnostics* (JMD) bimonthly with the Association for Molecular Pathology. Dr. Tim O'Leary succeeded Dr. Karen Kaul as Editor-in-Chief of JMD in January 2010. Readers of *AJP* or *JMD* are eligible to register for a 50 credit hour CME program based on reading articles in each of the two journals. In January 2011, ASIP transitioned from self-publishing to managed publishing with Elsevier for post-production services.
