Report to the Intersociety Pathology Council

Leadership: ASIP's current President is Dr. Kevin Roth, who will be succeeded by Dr. William B. Coleman on July 1, 2015.

Membership: ASIP membership is 1,400.

Meetings:

Annual Meeting: ASIP meets with several other member societies of FASEB each year at the scientific conference "Experimental Biology." The 2015 meeting will be in Boston, MA from March 28 to April 1. Guest societies sponsored by ASIP include American College of Veterinary Pathologists, American Society for Matrix Biology, Association of Pathology Chairs, Society for Cardiovascular Pathology, Society of Toxicologic Pathology, and the Italian Society of Pathology and Translational Medicine. Dr. Stanley Cohen will receive the ASIP Gold-Headed Cane Award and Dr. Charles A. Parkos is the recipient of the ASIP Rous-Whipple Award. Dr. Gene Siegal will receive the Robbins Distinguished Educator Award. Dr. Anindya Dutta will receive the Outstanding Investigator Award and Dr. Dipak Panigrahy will receive the Cotran Early Investigator Award.

Pathobiology for Investigators, Students, and Academicians (PISA): PISA is a newly organized annual scientific conference that will take place each Fall starting in 2015. This year's conference will focus on **Pathways to Translational Medicine: Recent Advances in Cell Injury, Inflammation, and Neoplasia** and will take place in Baltimore, MD from October 8 to 10. In addition to 17 invited world-renowned experts, there will be poster sessions and poster discussion break-out sessions.

Journals: ASIP's official journal is *The American Journal of Pathology* (AJP). Dr. Kevin Roth was appointed the new Editor-in-Chief on January 1, 2013. ASIP also co-publishes *The Journal of Molecular Diagnostics* (JMD) bimonthly with the Association for Molecular Pathology. Dr. Barbara Zehnbaauer succeeded Timothy O'Leary as Editor-in-Chief of JMD in January 2015. Readers of *JMD* are eligible to register for a 36 credit hour CME/SAM program based on reading selected articles.

Management of other societies. ASIP made a strategic decision in 2012 to limit the number of societies it manages. ASIP currently manages the Intersociety Council for Pathology Information (ICPI), which includes administration of the Pathology Honor Society in cooperation with the Association of Pathology Chairs. ASIP also manages the annual meeting of the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME).
