Report to the Intersociety Pathology Council

Leadership: ASIP's current President is Dr. Daniel G. Remick, MD, who will be succeeded by Dr. Asma Nusrat on July 1, 2018. Dr. William B. Coleman succeeded Dr. Mark E. Sobel as Executive Officer on February 1, 2018.

Membership: ASIP membership is 1,004.

Annual Meeting: ASIP meets with several other member societies of FASEB each year at the scientific conference "Experimental Biology." The 2018 meeting will be in San Diego, CA from April 21 to 24. Guest societies sponsored by ASIP include American College of Veterinary Pathologists, American Society for Matrix Biology, Association of Pathology Chairs, Society for Cardiovascular Pathology, and the Italian Society of Pathology and Translational Medicine. Dr. Janardan K. Reddy will receive the ASIP Gold-Headed Cane Award and Dr. Charles Serhan is the recipient of the ASIP Rous-Whipple Award. Dr. Shuji Ogino will receive the Outstanding Investigator Award and Dr. Pilar Alcaide will receive the Cotran Early Career Investigator Award. Dr. Emanuel Rubin received the Robbins Distinguished Educator Award at ASIP's fall conference (PISA) in September 2017.

Pathobiology for Investigators, Students, and Academicians (PISA): PISA is an annual scientific conference that takes place each fall. The 2018 conference will take place in Ann Arbor, MI from October 20-22, 2018. In addition to invited world-renowned experts, there will be poster sessions and poster discussion break-out sessions. Meritorious Award winners who will be recognized include Dr. Vinay Kumar (Gold-Headed Cane), Dr. Gabriel Nunez (Rous-Whipple), Dr. Scott Oakes (Outstanding Investigator), Dr. John Hanna (Cotran Early Career Investigator), and Dr. Gregory Tsongalis (Robbins Distinguished Educator).

Journals: ASIP's official journal is *The American Journal of Pathology* (AJP). Dr. Martha Furie is the newly appointed Editor-in-Chief. AJP and ASIP are charter members of the new NIH program to increase research reproducibility. ASIP also co-publishes *The Journal of Molecular Diagnostics* (JMD) bimonthly with the Association for Molecular Pathology. Dr. Barbara Zehnbauer succeeded Timothy O'Leary as Editor-in-Chief of JMD in January 2015. Readers of *JMD* are eligible to register for an 18-credit hour CME/SAM program based on reading selected articles.

Management of other societies. ASIP currently manages the Intersociety Council for Pathology Information (ICPI), which includes administration of the Pathology Honor Society and the Margaret Grimes Medical Student Interest Group Program.

Relationships with other societies. ASIP is a founding member of the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology (since 1913), Experimental Biology (1993), Intersociety Council for Pathology Information (1957), Pathology Round Table (2012), and the Intersociety Pathology Council (1968), and is a cooperating society of the American Board of Pathology.
